The Resuscitator can be used in case of smoke suffocation, drowning, gas poisoning, electric shock, drug poisoning, carbon monoxide, etc. It is in effect, a machine to produce artificial breathing of victims of any of the above causes.

These machines have been recommended for the use of fire departments for several years past. It is very infrequent that they are needed in municipalities such as this but on the occasion does demand, they have been responsible on many occasions in saving lives.
