

Ordinary feeds such as grains and forages supply certain essential minerals but mineral suuple-ments are necessary to supply calcium, phosphorus, salt, iodine, iron, copper, manganese and cobalt, ac-cording to scientists. All but the first three of these minerals are required in very small quantities.

Cattle, sheep and horses require a mineral supplement with a high proportion of phosphorus to calium since they are forage consumers and forage contains more calcium than phosphorus. Hogs on the other hand are grain consumers and require a mineral supplement




