careful planning and able leadership this worth-wity has been made available to thousands of boys and girls all over North America. Tailored to meet the special needs of boys in the 8 to 12 age group, Little League baseball has gained Under the leadership of various civic organizations and public-

spirited citizens, teams have been organized, equipment purchased, and in some cases special regulation size Little League parks Only about 4 years ago there were 94 Little League leagues of from 4 to 6 teams in existence. Today there are 1788 registered Little Leagues comprising 7,538 teams in the United States, its possessions and Canada. Approximate y 150,000 players are registered from the ages of 12 down.

In Canada, there are 6 Leagues in the Province of Quebec; 4 on the Island of Montreal, I, in St. Johns and 1 in St. Eustache. The Province of Manitoba has 25 full-fledged Little Leagues operating and British Columbia has 10.

Progress has been made in Little League baseball in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. There are leagues in Moncton, Saint John, Halifax and Sydney. There are fully equipped regulation Little League Parks in Manitoba and British Columbia. These add color, incentive and pride. Williamsport, Pa., with a population of 50,000 has fifteen fully equipped Little League baseball parks.

It is estimated that over 20,000,000 people witnessed Little League baseball this year in the United States and Canada. There were 7,000 games going every week, and as the season is 10 weeks long this would give you 70,000 games played per season.

The most significant thing about Litt'e League is the way it gets these boys in their formative years, giving them a chance to learn good sportsmanship, team play and proper submission to constituted authority. It gives the boys something constructive to do. It gives them a standing among their own age group and gives them a place in the community. It helps the boys overcome self-consciousness. Among the important lessons it teaches are good sportsmanship, fair play, team play, and how to get along with others. On top of this, it provides wholesome recreational activity


