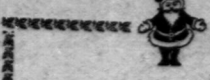

PORT DOVER ARENA IN OPERATION

The dreams of sports minded citizens of Port Dover and surrounding community became a reality this past week when the artificial ice was finally ready for play. Skating was enjoyed on Friday and Saturday evenings and on Sunday afternoon a Norfolk League game was played and the Port Dover team sent their fans home happy with ten to three win over Simcoe Canoe. In the first period the Sailors scored four times. Tarvitt from Smith and Brown at 9:40, Tarvitt from McCauley at 10:15, McCauley from Tarvitt at 10:30 and Doug Mummery from Don Mummery at 10:50. Bentley and the same combination clicked again at 14:37 to end the scoring for the second period. There was a rash of penalties in the period. Smith for elbowing at 1:50, Tarvitt and Gardner for roughing at 2:48, Brown for high sticking at 4:53, Mullin and Don Mummery for fighting at 10:08, Mummery at 10:57, Doug Mummery for charging at 14:55 and Smith for boarding at 16:55.

In the third, Brown scored his third goal from Melville and Tarvitt at 1:35 and McCauley notched the final Port Dover goal at 8:13. Vic Gibbons scored Canoe's final goal at 19:32 on a shot from the blue line. The period was just as rugged as the first two, Pratt went off for holding the puck at 4:15 and again at 8:20 for kneeing. Doug Mummery was chased for holding at 11:15. Don Mummery for elbowing at 13:36 and J. Bentley and Kennedy for fighting at 19:01. Tarvitt and Brown were the high scorers for Port Dover in a game that was rugged right from start to finish. Referee Al Langford and Jim Mullin had their hands full to keep the play in check but managed to keep the game from becoming a free for all. Canoe were without the services of Jack Dyle and he was missed on the defence. Paul Allen, DeMarco were also absent while Irv Nohse was not in uniform. DONALD A. McARTHUR NEW TELEPHONE MANAGER

(Intended for last issue) Donald A. McArthur has been appointed Bell Telephone manager for Jarvis with headquarters at Simcoe, Ont. He succeeds Frank G. Martin who has been appointed Manager at Galt.

Mr. McArthur who will also have supervision over the company's offices at Cayuga, Fisherville, Hagersville, Port Dover, Scotland, Selkirk and Waterford, has been Manager for Listowel and vicinity since April 1948.

Born and educated in Galt, Mr. McArthur began his telephone career there in 1929, and since that time has had a wide experience in all aspects of the telephone business. Between 1930 and 1942 he served in various positions in Stratford, Sarnia, London, St. Thomas, Owen Sound, New Toronto, Toronto, Oshawa, Grimsby and Sault Ste. Marie.

After three years with the Royal Canadian Corps of Signals in World War II, he returned to the Bell Company as business office supervisor at Stratford in 1945 and in 1947 was transferred to the staff of the company's general offices in Toronto, the position he left to take over as manager at Listowel.

Mr. Martin, who has been manager here since July, 1950, was born and educated in Toronto and joined the Bell Company there as a clerk in 1927. During the next few years he gained considerable experience in various phases of the telephone industry, and was granted leave of absence in 1943 to serve with the Royal Canadian Air Force.

He was a Squadron Leader when he retired from the R.C.A.F. in 1945. He was appointed manager at Listowel in January, 1946, on his return to the company from war service and was appointed manager at Leamington in May, 1948, the position he left to take over as manager for Simcoe and vicinity.
