BUSY FARMER

Do you know that flies alone can
reduce the milk flow as much as 15
per cent and when they are present
in large numbers the loss may be
much higher? Putting up with them
in the farm yard is therefore
not only unsanitary but it is uneco-
nomic and in addition very expen-
sive. Spraying with one of the re-
cognized products on the market will
do much to keep them in check.
Screening all windows where neces-
sary and practical is also recom-
mended. More important still, it is
always best to keep the house and
manure hauled out and spread it as
it forms the most serious single
source of fly trouble. Dairymen who
are not alone in being attacked. It
is reported that beef production can
be reduced by as much as one-third
to one-half pound per day during
the fly season.
