## Pen, Scissors and Pastepot

"R.M.P." had a very thought-provoking editorial in Monday's edition of the Simcoe Reformer entitled "Highway Tragedies." The black record of the past few weeks certainly justifies editorial comment in all newspapers in the area. Our only objection to his comments are those relative to the condition of the highway. He says the road is in poor condition both where grading is underway and also in other sections. Our view is the direct opposite. In fact we marvel at the ability of road builders to construct a new highway and at the same time permit the continued flow of traffic. We have been travelling No. 3 Highway regularly since work was undertaken on the road and at no time have we recognized a condition which might cause an accident if reasonable precaution is observed. The road is littered with signs warning the public that construction work is going on; motorists are warned to drive carefully; alternate routes are suggested if they do not choose to travel this road. Under the circumstances we think the blame is wrongly placed for any accident when it is suggested the Department of Highways or the contractor, through negligence in any sense responsible. People who drive cars are to blame. After all we don't hold the owner of a skyscraper responsible when someone jumps from the thirtieth story.

It would seem from this distance that there have been enough fatalities near the dam at Caledonia to warrant placing that section of the river out of bounds to the public.

After having spent a Sunday afternoon at the Norfolk County Park near Port Rymer, we are forced to go on record as being in favour of county parks. The new Norfolk County Park is a long way yet from being an ideal picnic spot, but it is most nice enough to attract almost as many people as it can accommodate. All facilities were in use and the beach was crowded. Refreshments were being dispensed by Harry Smith from a booth. Everyone seemed to be enjoying themselves. It will take a few years to bring the park city to the peak of its attractiveness, but in the meantime it is apparently providing a very satisfactory spot for the public seeking the cooling lake breeze on the seventh day of the week.

We would suggest that Canadians have never been happier in the choice of Presidential candidates in the U.S. than they are at the present time. Both the Republican and Democratic choices, General Dwight Eisenhower and Governor Adlai Stevenson, would make Presidents that the Canadian people could find little objection to. ## "Miss Canada" Pageant

Hamilton, July 30 - Announcement that Miss America 1953, lovely, talented Kay Hutchins, of Salt Lake City, Utah, will attend the Miss Canada Pageant at Burlington on August 11, brings the total to three lovely girls who will be special guests that night. Two of them are Miss Canada title-holders, Marjorie Kelly "Miss Canada 1952", of Courtland, Ont., who crowns the lucky entrant chosen that exciting night and Betty Jean Ferguson, "Miss Canada 1948", of Halifax, N.S., who is on the panel of judges.  
High calibre of ambitious, talented and beautiful young entrants in this summer's Pageant has set interest at fever pitch and promises an evening of truly sparkling entertainment for audience — plus a real problem for the judges. Many of the girls aspiring for the scholarship of \$1,000 — plus a trip to the Coronation next year, and the opportunity of competing in the Miss America Pageant in September with scholarship stipends, or are already launched in dramatics, dancing, or world of music.

## ON THE FARM FRONT

There is one thing that should be kept in mind regardless of whether prices are high or low and that is that it usually takes five pigs of a litter to pay for the sow's keep and their own feed. This means that every little pig is saved. It may be the case, then every pig raised is a profit. High efficiency of production always pays off in good times or in bad.  
A new circular, number 129, entitled "Legume Pollination in Ontario" has been issued as part of the program of the Legume Research Committee in the Province and farm areas interested in legume seed production would be well advised to get a copy. It is a checklist of valuable information on the best possible methods to be followed in securing proper pollination of these seed crops. For instance it points out that contrary to the popular belief, honey bees are efficient pollinators of red clover. It also answers the question as to how many colonies of bees are required per acre of crop in order to get a proper coverage. A copy of the circular can be had by dropping a card to your agricultural representative.  
The application of liquid fertilizers to crops is being given a rather wide trial use this season. This method of applying "trace" elements is not new but it is in applying the major elements such as nitrogen, phosphate and potash is a relatively new development, although still somewhat in the experimental stage. If there are any farmers in Haldimand County who are trying out this foliar application it would be appreciated if they would report their results to the Department of Agriculture office at Cayuga.

## WOODWORKERS END STRIKE

The multi-million dollar strike of 32,000 British Columbia woodworkers is settled and only a few minor points remain to be smoothed out before the men go back to work. It was announced at Vancouver that the C.I.O. International Woodworkers of America union and the companies had accepted a proposed settlement that will give the workers a 9 1/2 cents an hour increase. The workers had been out for 45 days. New basic wage will be \$1.35.
