Pen, Scissors and Pastepot

With the arrival of the Port Dover Maple Leaf this week we found that all one needs to do to make the headlines in that paper is to attend an opening of the Ontario Legislature. The Maple Leaf Editor attends as one of neglecting our editorial duties in hobnobbing with the elite of the Province at the opening of the Legislature. Nothing could be further from the truth. Actually we went down to the legislature as a one man lobby to try and get good old Haldimand de-hyphenated from our sand-dune neighbour, Norfolk.

The Port Dover Editor's recital of census statistics doesn't excite us very much. The official population of Norfolk, he says, is 42,708 as against Haldimand's 24,138. Of Norfolk's 42,708, only 20,857 are females and personally they are the only residents up there that count with us. Now take "Miss Canada's" there's a girl for you.

The stabilizing force of Haldimand has been holding Norfolk together for a long time. We have mentioned before the transfer of soil components which is one of our most valuable contributions to our neighbour. In fact it could be likened to the "Marshall Plan."

Anyone who is at all familiar with conditions in Norfolk realizes that as a separate entity it would fall apart overnight. As proof of this we cite the frequent divergences of opinion on matters of minor importance such as the extent of the savageness of individual hockey players.

At the present time, as the Port Dover Editor knows, Jarvis is the Capital of Haldimand-Norfolk and Jarvis, we suggest, wears that distinction with great honour. Now just imagine what would happen if Haldimand de-hyphenated Norfolk. Simcoe would obviously want to become the Capital of the new constituency because Simcoe is the home of the newspaper with the largest cir-

culation of any town weekly in Canada. Port Dover wouldn't settle for that because hasn't Port Dover the largest fresh water fishing fleet any place in the world. We mustn't overlook Delhi. Delhi already is a Capital on at least at the Cross-roads of Norfolk County's rich fields of tobacco lands. So it can be on the Toronto Daily Star this week, the Star "Canada's richest, and most successful paper he qualifies the statement by saying it is not necessarily Canada's greatest newspaper. We figure, too, it is just as well for Norfolk to stick to the truth. Star journalism, Pierre says, "is a baffling potpourri of the ridiculous and the sublime" and the paper itself is one whose "disdain for its readers at one moment is as axiomatic as its solicitude for them the next." The article says that although the Star championed high income and succession taxes it's owner worried about his own personal taxes and adds that "this critic says that the controversial Charitable Foundation which he left behind him was a dodge to escape the very succession duties he advocated. Could be.
