MILLIONETH HOLSTEIN
HEIFER REGISTERED

An important milestone in the annals of animal husbandry in Canada has been reached with the registration of the millioneth purebred Holstein heifer. She is appropriately named Oceola Miss Million and is owned by Theodore Young, Paris, Ont.

The first Holstein was imported in 1881 and the 500,000th female registered in 1941. More than twice as many Holsteins were registered last year as all other dairy breeds combined.
