GLEANNING FROM OTTAWA

Ottawa, Nov. 12. — (CP) — Dwight Eisenhower's sweep to the presidency in the United States elections last week of vital interest to government officials on Parliament Hill. The elections were an inevitable to-be of discussion at a routine cabinet meeting here two days later.

From that meeting came an authoritative report that Prime Minister St. Laurent feels the Republican triumph will not alter the friendly relations across the Canada-United States border developed during 20 years of Democratic party government. He is also reported sharing Ottawa's hopes that a number of important developments are in the wind.

Mr. St. Laurent is understood to hope that the U.S. will lift the ban on imports of Canadian meat and livestock "very soon." This would reopen the American market to producers who have been shut off from last winter's foot-and-mouth disease outbreak.

There are also hopes that something will be done soon south of the border to name an American authority to settle possibly the State of New York - to co-operate with Canada in the construction of the St. Lawrence Seaway project.

Stating that that authority is the only bar remaining to a start on construction of the power project — a joint undertaking between the two countries — and the seaway, which will be built by Canada alone. No broad change is expected in relations between the two countries, which in the past years have seen major strides in mutual trade, defence co-operation, diplomacy and other fields. There appears to be confidence that this trend will continue under Gen. Eisenhower.

It is understood Mr. St. Laurent has plans now to go to Washington to visit the new president. But that doesn't necessarily mean he won't go sometime in the next six months.


