are having difficultty with granary weevil this fall. With bins full and no place to put the grain this presents a problem. Fumigation of the grain is one method that can be followed but the bins must be practically air tight for it to be effective. Most bins would require too much repair to be of any use in uhis way. One method that has been used is to run the grain over a fanning mill. This will do much to cool the grain down and will eliminate many of the weevils. This is particularly effective during cold weather when the weevils become inactive and can be gathered up and destroyed.

Last minute repairs to pens, stalls and stabling in general should not be postponed any longer. For sake of convenience, if for no other reason, bad spots in the floor should be renewed.
