### SOIL SENSE

With winter here again and the livestock once more stabled for five or six months, another phase of soil fertility must be considered. I refer, of course, to farm manure. The job of cleaning out the stables every day, while not particularly enjoyable work, is at least a steady job and not without its reward. Most farmers today realize the value of farm manure as an agricultural by-product. Depending on how it is handled, farm manure can add a great deal to soil fertility, or it can have little more value than the organic matter or humus it adds to the soil. How much value it has depends to a large extent on the farm operator. First of all let's look at farm manure as a fertilizer. One ton of average manure ready for the field is said to have an analysis of 10-5-10, i.e., 10 per cent of total nitrogen, 5 per cent phosphoric acid and 10 per cent potash. Also present are all the trace elements, as well as calcium, magnesium and sulphur. Actually this might be called a low analysis fertilizer. But farm manure is usually applied at about ten tons per acre. At this rate the nutrients supplied to the land total approximately 100 pounds of nitrogen, 50 pounds of phosphoric acid and 100 pounds of potash. But only about half of the nitrogen and potash is readily available and worse still, only one sixth of the phosphoric acid. This examination of farm manure shows us how little phosphoric acid is contained in the average manure. The result is an unbalanced fertilizer far from effective in treating the soil. This is especially true in Haldimand County. There is however, a remedy for this condition, and that is to restore the manure with some form of phosphoric fertilizer. This may be done very easily and at low cost by applying superphosphate rock phosphate or hypophosphate to the guano daily or to the box stalls before bedding. The rate of application should be about two pounds of fertilizer per cow per day. Reinforcing farm manure in this manner not only adds much needed phosphoric acid but the dry fertilizer also soaks up and holds much of the liquid portion of the manure. The total nitrogen and potash. This second point is an important one to remember when handling farm manure. This winter the Haldimand Soils Committee is conducting a demonstration in a pen barn, using two forms of phosphate fertilizer. The

two fertilizers (rock phosphate and hyperphosphate) will be applied separately to the manure as it builds up in the pen. In the spring the rock phosphate manure and the hyperphosphate manure will be spread on separate plots on the corn ground. A third plot will be for manure that has not been reinforced with fertilizer. Next fall and the following year observations and yield tests will be made.

The reader is cautioned not to expect profitable crop increases for two to four years after an application of manure.
