This week we would like to deal with Liberal policies as they affect agriculture. In order to be fair, let us compare the lot of the farmer today with conditions in the past. It is obvious to anyone after careful thought that there are very few farmers who would care to revert to their financial position of even fifteen years ago. Most farms in the present are equipped with electric power and many of the attendant labour-saving devices. All most every farmer has a much greater investment in machinery, which has only been possible because his farm income has been high enough to place in his hands the necessary purchasing power.

Little attention was paid to agriculture until the first King Government came into office in 1921. Prior to this the Meighen government had voted only five and a half million dollars for agriculture. During the first King administration the allocation was increased yearly until it reached a total of nine million dollars in 1929-30. During the Conservative Bennett administration the estimate was 7.5 million and the Liberal government actually spent over 10 million dollars. These figures are startling to this extent, that they indicate that while agriculture is considered in both parties, the last two Conservative administrations have reduced expenditures almost to the vanishing point, whereas the Liberal Government has doubled the amount spent in both parties.
