FILL CO-OPERATION OF FARMERS IS REQUESTED FOR THE JUNE FARM SURVEY

Forms for the June survey of crops and livestock are being mailed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics to farmers and will be in their hands about June 1st.

The Ontario Department of Agriculture stresses the importance of this survey and urges all farmers to complete the form and return it in the postage free envelope supplied.

Widespread responses from all districts and farm types is required for a good measurement of the farm situation.

Statistics on agricultural production are essential in drawing up policies to improve and further the interests of farmers. Farm organizations use this information in their presentations to governments and commissions on behalf of the farming population. Businesses and services that deal with farmers require up-to-date figures on production trends in planning their future operations and many farmers themselves use such information in their farm management decisions.

Individual replies are strictly confidential and are not related to taxation of any kind. Figures are grouped for areas and farm types to get county and provincial estimates which will be published.
