PEANUT BUTTER PINWHEEL LOAF

Mix and sift into a bowl, 3 c. one-activated pastry flour (or 2 1/2 c. one-activated hard wheat flour), 1/4 tsp. baking powder, 1/2 tsp. salt. Cut in 7 lbs. chilled shortening. Combine 1/2 c. milk and 1/4 tsp. vanilla. Make a well in dry ingredients and add liquid, mix lightly with a fork. Knead for 10 seconds on lightly-floured board and roll out to 1/2" thick rectangle, 10" x 18". Fold in three from top and bottom edges, roll dough up like a jelly roll and place in a greased loaf pan (4 1/2" x 8 1/2"). Bake in a hot oven, 400°, about 45 minutes. Serve hot, cut in thick slices, or cold, cut in thin slices, lightly spread with butter or margarine.

Marlene was born with the lure of golf in her veins. Her home in Fonthill is only a short walk from the nearby Lookout Point links, and at a very early age, she was there, hitting balls for professional Gordon McIntosh.
