



It has recently been brought to the attention of the County Insurance Committee that during the past few weeks, many substancial automobile accident judgements have been hand ed down from the courts in the province: at Brockville \$62,000 to a widow and three children; at Toronto over \$60,000 against the driver of a truck which collided with a passenger-loaded bus; at Toronto \$33,600 to a girl who lost a leg in an automobile accident; at Whitby \$54,000 for a permanent brain injury to a man 26 years old earning \$3,000 a year. In addition there have been two recent out-of-court settlements for \$42,000 each. Ontario Farm Forums are going to discuss adequate insurance coverage for the farm family next Monday evening, November 22nd.
