Kent, bought from Mr. William Youmans the present school site, consisting of one acre, being the eastern part of lot 18 in the fourth concession of Townsend, for two hundred dollars. Here, was built the present one-roomed brick school. Spruce trees have been planted around the yard. The maple trees north of the gate were planted by Miss M. Jenson, the first teacher of the school. The official opening and pupils just moved in with books and equipment. Later, a school concert with residents of the community assisting in a walk from No. 3 Highway to the school. The lumber was so hard that the nails had to be soaked in oil before they could be driven into the planks according to the memory of Miss Jenson, who taught three years in the new school.
