How Rainbows Occur
 A rainbow always appears in the sky opposite the sun. The person looking at the rainbow has his back to the sun. The rainbow is due to the bending and reflection of the sun's rays when they are shining on raindrops in the sky. The white light of the sun is composed of all the colors mixed together; but when this white light passes through a drop of rain, the rays composing it are bent to different degrees, and so forced apart. When they reach the back of the raindrop, these separated rays—violet, indigo, blue, green, yellow, orange, red—are reflected back to the eye. 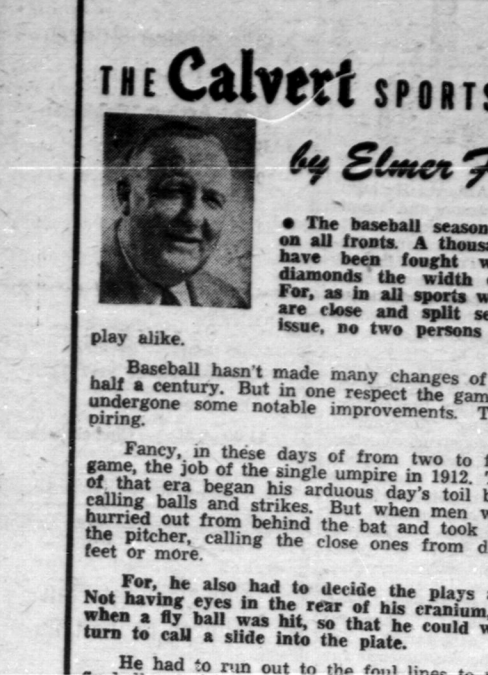
Why Some Animals Grow So Fast

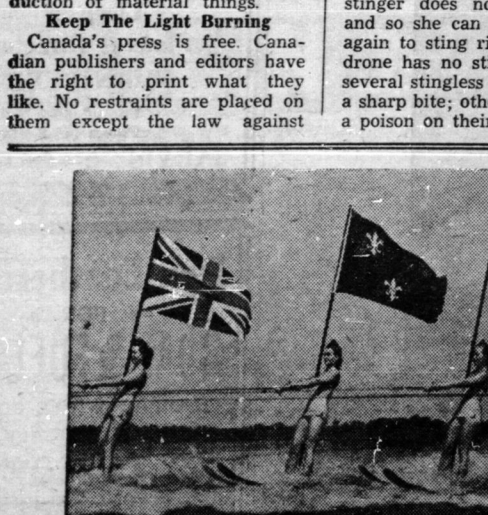

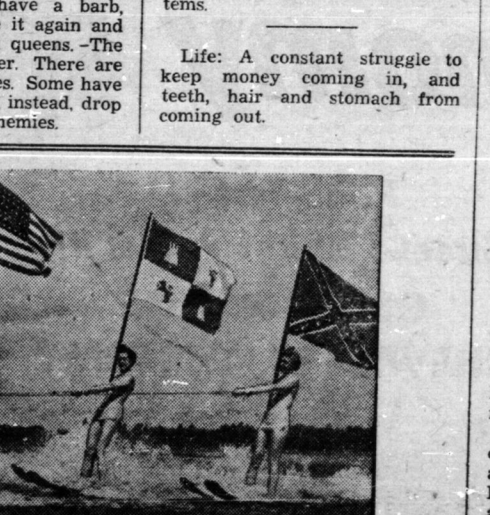
