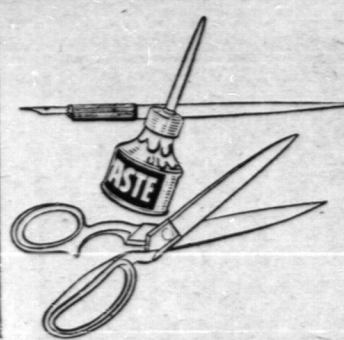

For generations the people of this nation have been reading about catastrophes in other parts of the world. We sympathized, in a sense, with the unfortunate victims of these disasters. But we were smug in the belief such disasters were meant for others and that it couldn't happen

here. In fact we still held to that belief until early this week when pictures and stories of the calamity in the Toronto area began to sink in. After all Toronto is getting pretty close to home. We still can't understand why so many lives were lost because they were unable to cope with the forces of nature. We can be thankful, however, that we are amply blessed with the materials to restore the damage and compensate for losses to the victims which is being demonstrated by the ready response to the "Hazel" Fund. We cannot restore the lives that have been lost.

People in the Jarvis area can be extremely thankful that little damage occurred here. An American lost control of his car when he hit a ditch discharging its cargo. Wrecking crews righted the vehicle and covered the load except for one 12 gal. keg. Typical of human nature, the hunt has been on since that time. Individuals, groups, and the O.P.P. have been probing the depths of the flooded ditch in a determined effort to find the missing keg. The last report we received was that the water had disappeared but so has the keg. The question is — who has it?

The official opening of the New Norfolk General Hospital, at Simcoe yesterday is an achievement that should bring satisfaction to the citizens of this community.
