**THOR HANSEN CREATOR OF CANADIAN CRAFTS**

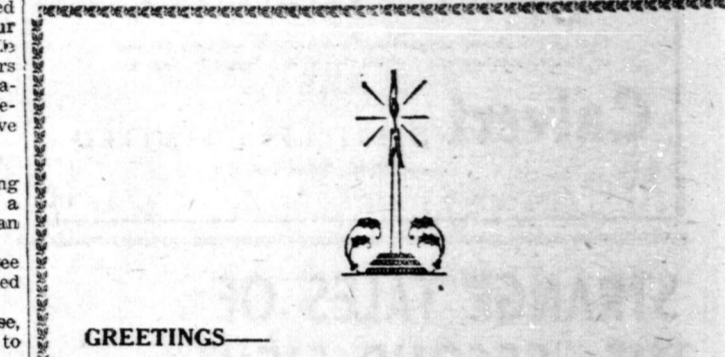

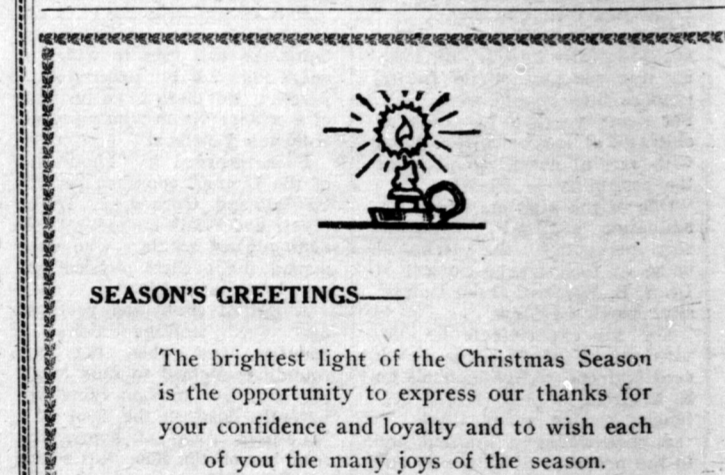
