INDIAN SOCIALIST REPUBLIC

THE INDIAN NATIONAL CONGRESS, ruling party in that country, has announced that the nation's goal is a Socialist pattern of society. This is said to be "India's own brand of Socialism, thickly interwoven with private enterprise."

Prime Minister Nehru himself has repeated his former statements that he believes the country could not progress without private industry. Hitherto he went no further than to say that he was in favor of the welfare state, and he now believes that by stating plainly that the aim of his government is Socialism he will "steal the thunder of the Communists."

The fact is that Russia is already a real Communist State, and it is a grim example of the end-product of Socialism. As for Mr. Nehru's assurance that his brand of Socialism will be "thickly interwoven with private enterprise," that is a contradiction in terms.

Mr. Nehru is right when he says that India could not progress without private enterprise in industry. The word enterprise connotes individual initiative and persistence. The enterprising spirit is a readiness to engage in undertakings of difficulty and risk.

Nothing less than a qualified Royal Commission is likely to find the facts necessary to an objective analysis of the value of a national redistribution scheme that alters the lives of all Canadians.

The majority of taxpayers whom the government presumes to be in favor of this arbitrary distortion of their incomes and equities should be given an opportunity for second thought regarding the future of their government-manipulated lives.

The threat to the future well-being of industrialists and their Canadians, which appears to exist in present welfare policies, should be examined by competent judges.

It is of the utmost importance to learn whether Canada can provide adequate care for our social casualties while the present rate of government welfare payments continues.

Expenditures so large as to radically affect the ability of working Canadians to raise and educate their families while providing against misfortune and old age should be impartially and frequently scrutinized. It is unwise and unsafe to assume that the basic function of government is the redistribution of earnings and savings.
