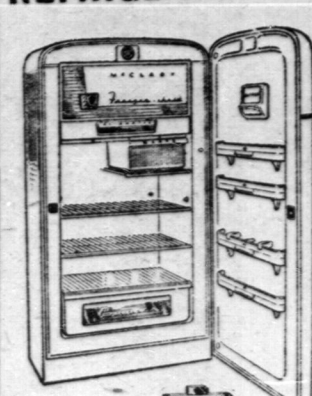

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Marie Saunders Reports

The Farm

Dulas, Radnor, Wales, July 10th, 1955

We are again in a different part of the British Isles — now being over in Wales. Marjorie and I are both staying at the same place and really enjoying it. First, however, I must tell you about the Royal Show in Nottingham.

We stayed from Monday until Friday at the big university hall in Nottingham. In all, there were forty young people from various parts of the world visiting here just the same as we are — from U.S., New Zealand, Australia, Southern Rhodesia, Israel and Jamaica. You can imagine what good fun it was.

The Royal covers about 120 acres so you don't see it all in one day. In the three days we attended, I guess we did see most of it. The cattle show was the best I have ever seen. The Queen and Duke were there on the Wednesday and on the Thursday. The exhibits are very artistic — flowers and decorations make them most lovely. It is strictly an agricultural show — a lot of things are not appreciated. The weather was quite warm and I'm sure we walked miles every day.

On Friday we went down to London to spend the night before going across to Wales. Naturally, we wished to see the sights of London, so out we went! First, we had a ride on the tube (subway). It is like going into a mine, much deeper than Toronto. We walked through Piccadilly Circus, saw Trafalgar Square and went down the Mall, along here we saw Clarence House and before we realized it, there we were in front of Buckingham Palace. The two guards were pacing back and forth — in fact there is a groove worn in the roadwork. I was told that the Queen's car is not allowed to go past No. 10 Downing Street, along Westminster Abbey past the Parliament Building and Big Ben until we were in the Thames River. From there we could see St. Paul's Cathedral. It was a most thrilling visit. There were so many wonderful places in a couple of hours.

Here in Wales we are again in the hills — and there are lots of sheep. This will be our last two weeks in England.

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
