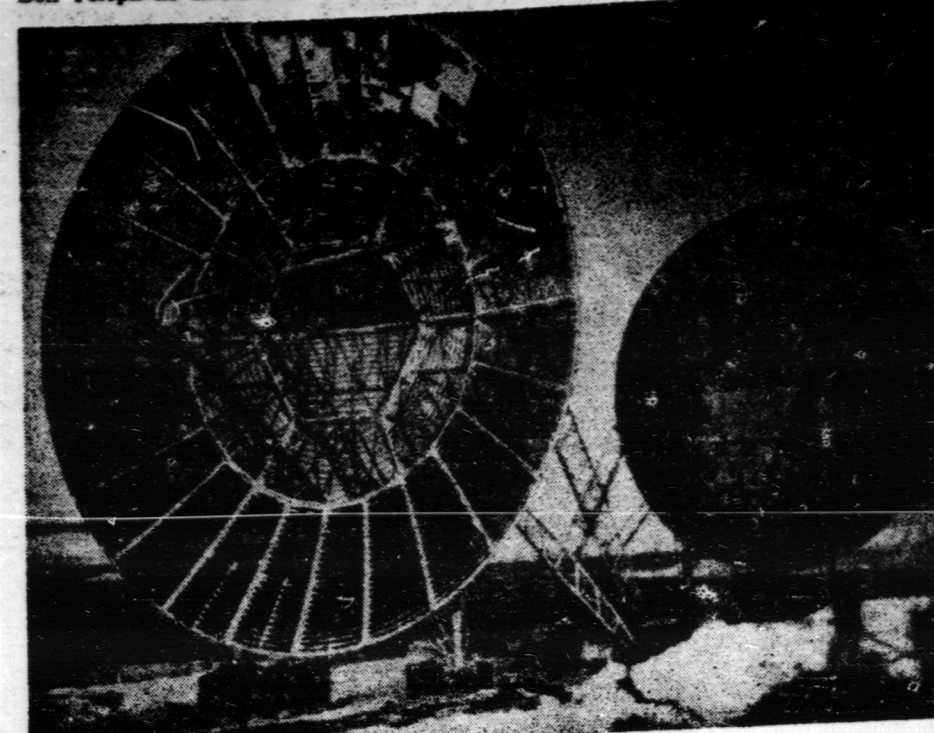

Bell Telephone Establishes Over-the-Horizon Communications in Canada's Sub-Arcic



Up along the wild and rocky coastline of eastern Canada's sub-Arcic, communications line is being made by a team of Canadian experts working on a vital continental defence project.

According to the November issue of "The Blue Bell," Bell Telephone's employees' magazine, members of the company's special contract department have set up the world's first full-scale installation of "tropospheric scatter" microwave transmission equipment. With this installation an accomplished fact, Bell's special contract people are now devoting their energies largely to the Mid-Canada Line.

In this new and advanced concept of over-the-horizon radio relay transmission, antennas resembling giant dishes are used for gathering in the tiny microwaves.

Before the development of over-the-horizon radio relay transmission, microwave towers had to be located within line-of-sight—or not more than 30 miles apart—because microwaves do not follow the earth's curvature and tend to eventually diffuse into space.

On the new "tropospheric scatter" installation, however, Bell crews were

able to locate their antennae many times more than the conventional 30 miles apart, because engineers had discovered that, given sufficient power, the microwaves tend to bounce back to earth again in little pieces. The huge dishes can collect enough of those pieces to produce an effective signal—hence the term "scatter."

The voice channels used on this type of installation are so high in frequency that two people located a thousand miles apart could converse as though they were in the same room.

"This construction job has no mean challenge," the Blue Bell article discloses. "The over-the-horizon transmission principle had been tried out on small test links set up in the southern United States and in our own country. But no one could foresee all the difficulties ahead in setting up and maintaining a high fidelity radio communication system in the frozen north."
