At a meeting of the Building Committee, under the chairmanship of Mr. A. L. Tambling in the Board Room at the Hospital last Monday, Mr. Fraser, of A. B. Scott and Associates, architects. Welland, was present to discuss the preliminary layouts of the proposed new nurses residence on the old Thomas Marshall property adjoining the hospital. A number of plans were considered, including ranch style, semi-brick and full brick, the residence to contain 12 rooms. The Building Committee will study the flans and will report

Was made at this meeting, but it has since been revealed that the present estimates point to \$40,000 as the cost of the residence, and already the Committee are assured of a very generous gift of \$25,000 from Mr. Thomas Camelford, plus some \$18,000 in grants from the Ontario and Federal Departments of Health, so that the full cost of the building seems to be assured, even if it runs a little above estimates. This is a very happy situation and is naturally very gratifying to the Board of Governors as whole.


