Former Training School Site Has Been Leased For Sports Car Racing Meets

Motor Club Will Operate and Develop Site

It was learned today that preliminary arrangements have been completed between Russell and Larry Hare, owners of the former Jarvis Bombing and Gunnery School site, near Nanticoke, and the British Empire Motor Club, of Toronto, to lease approximately 150 acres for the purpose of operating and developing a sports car and motorcycle racing track. The development will be known as Harewood Acres.

The British Empire Motor Club, formerly operated at a site near Eggenville which has been taken over by other interests with the object of developing a second Indianapolis Speedway in Canada.

The Club regards the location near Nanticoke as being ideally located and the runways and hangar strips fit in perfectly with the development of a track.

The British Empire Motor Club has four hundred members in Toronto alone. They operate high powered sports cars of French, German, British, Italian and American makes. They are planning on holding four or five races annually and the first one is scheduled for this month. This will be restricted to motorcycles and will be for sports cars.
