ON THE FARM FRONT -

It coming out, known as Richmond, is a high yielding winter hardy variety that was developed at the Central Experimental Station, Saskatoon. It is resistant to bunt or stinking smut, but unfortunately for central and western Ontario it may not be so satisfactory since it is quite susceptible to loose smut. The treatment to loose smut is very cumbersome and not very practical. The result of all this is that probably we should stick to the three varieties already named.

The prospects for small seed production seems to be quite variable this year. For instance in the case of alfalfa a substantial decrease in yield is being reported in Saskatchewan. Manitoba seems to have a somewhat larger acreage, so far as alfalfa is concerned, than in the past. There is also likely to be quite a bit of alfalfa in Alberta as well as in the other provinces. The alfalfa crop comes from this province and production will likely be down considerably.

Just a reminder not to forget the weed menace. During the hot summer days it is easier to kill weeds than at any other time of year and every possible opportunity should be taken to keep them in check. Take special care for instance. Here is a weed that is spreading rapidly and to it or it will take possession of the field or the farm. It is a biennial and it can be kept from flowering and producing seed if it could eventually be destroyed. Of course there will be a good supply of unwanted seed in the soil and it would take a few years but it could be done.

Sheep are very useful in keeping alfalfa in check. Frequent close mowing is also helpful. Chemical control has been used with varying results in the past. It is classed as susceptible to 2-D and as such six to eight ounces of acid per acre should be adequate for all practical purposes, at least for the control of the top growth. Along fence rows this application should be stepped up to one pound of acid per acre with plenty of water. In those places where 2-D does not give service then it might be a good idea to try something else. Some have used brushkill with success.

Alfalfa is a hungry crop and it has been reported that every ton you remove from a field takes with it 45 pounds of phosphorus, 45 pounds of potash and 75 pounds of lime. This simply means that the best results may be necessary to feed this crop a little better.
