The name "United Nations" has become familiar throughout the western world in recent years. In the functioning of the United Nations Organization various bodies have been set up to deal with specific matters. Among these is the Economic and Social Council. The E. and S. C. group recently studied marriage and divorce laws in fourteen member countries because of their effect on population. They show a great diversity.

In Pakistan, a Moslem may have four wives and a Hindu any number. But in Tennessee a man can get 21 years in prison for having only two. In Sweden, under ordinary circumstances, no man may marry under 21 years of age, nor a woman under 18. In Argentina, Honduras, Panama

and Northern Ireland, on the other hand, a boy may marry at 14 and a girl at 12, provided they have parental consent.

We can't help, but wonder how long it will take to establish uniform marriage and divorce laws in the member countries of the U.N.

The Presbyterian Church has called on the Federal Government for more aid to Old Age Pensioners.

The resolution came at the 82nd General Assembly in Toronto despite the protests of one minister who said recuring into politics is a "monstrous thing which goes against all the traditions of the Church."

A newly married man, obviously not responsible for what he was saying, referred to us recently—at a public gathering—as the Editor of the Port Dover Maple Leaf. What a humiliating experience. We find it impossible to reconcile ourselves to the thought that many fine, upstanding people in the Renton district will carry an altogether mistaken image of what the editor of the Port Dover Maple Leaf really looks like. From information we have in our secret files such a function should not be too far distant. Then, the good people of the Wiggins community will be able to see for themselves the reason for our current humiliation.

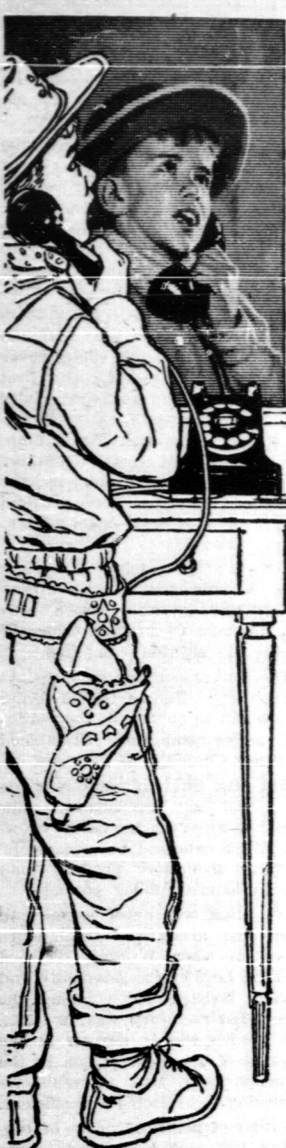
