In "The Gospel In Many Tongues" specimens of 826 languages and dialects are each numbered and accompanied by a brief, general geographicale note to enable readers to locate the language on the map. The text itself, where available, is St. John 3:16 Otherwise it is a quotation from one of the other Gospels or New Testament portion. Where the letter is used the reference is given. The publishing date of each language is another feature. The date cited usually coincides with the year the language was finally reduced to written form. Interesting indeces are included. 
