DISAGREABLE WEATHER

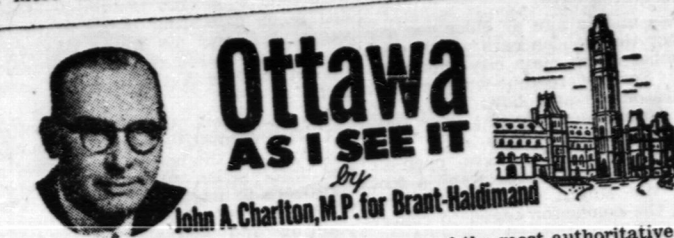
During the past week-end, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, Jarvis district experienced some real unpleasant weather.

The question of who is to be Canada's next Governor-General is a subject of considerable interest around Ottawa.

One of the most authoritative commentators on matters of government in Canada is H. MacGregor Dawson, in Canada's "The Government of Canada" he says on this subject:

Incidentally, while I doubt that the demands made on it, is a profitable position, the incumbent hardly lives on it.

There are great changes in the Government's staff since the post-war period. The Governor-General's office has been re-established at the Confederation Building in 1957.

There is not too likely to be so at a time like the present, when one government has been in office for a period when we have had four Governments.

There are times, too, when the Governor-General exercises a very real and vital influence on public affairs.

Imagine, however, the death of a Prime Minister in office when several of his Cabinet are contending for his post.

A large part of the Governor-General's job concerns itself with being the sociable head of the state, and the leader in such fields as the arts, youth movement, education, history and the like.

Bell Telephone Co. Forging Ahead

More telephones were added, more money spent on new construction, more calls handled and more service by the Bell Telephone Company of Canada than ever before in any of its history during 1956.

According to the company's 77th annual report, the net increase of 243,468 telephones brought the total in service in the Bell Ontario-Quebec territory to 2,766,143.

A total of \$130,677,707 in wages and salaries was paid to Bell employees in Ontario and Quebec last year. At the end of 1956 the company employed 39,658 people, 24,056 of whom were in Ontario.

Expenditures for new construction in Ontario and Quebec during 1956 totalled \$339,500,000 and the company expects to spend another \$17,000,000 on construction during 1957.

In this message to shareholders, Thomas W. Eadie, president, said the continuing rise in costs has been particularly offset by higher productivity gained through placing in service equipment which handles more calls.

In order to meet service obligations, the company must be able to raise the capital to finance necessary growth. This could be done at reasonable cost only so long as earnings were healthy, the company's financial structure sound and its surplus sufficient to carry through a period of severe strain.

Shareholders increased by more than 15,000 during 1956 and now number 140,728, of whom 137,763 are residents of Canada. Only nine per cent of the shares are now owned outside the country, including the five per cent held by the American Telephone and Telegraph Company.

Over 11,000 employees and pensioners are shareholders, with their holdings amounting to nearly eight per cent of the total stock.

EXPANSION
