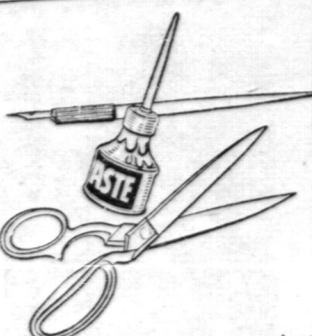

On the Farm Front

BRIEF NOTES FOR THE BUSY FARMER

Late blight has been discovered in tomato fields in Haldimand. Late last week, Mr. W. S. Carpenter of the Fruit and Vegetable Extension Service at Vineland visited the county and discovered the disease in at least three fields. Since then a report has reached the office of the Department of Agriculture at Cayuga, and heavy dew the disease is likely to spread rapidly. Growers with crops not now affected should do well to see that their crop is well sprayed with Bordeaux 10-5-100 and to shorten the interval between sprays from 10 days to 7 days. This may mean the difference between having a crop and no crop.

Seed wheat prices have just been suggested for the current season by the Seed Marketing and Publicity Committee of the Ontario Soil and Crop Improvement Association. They range from \$2.25 per bushel for Registered No. 1 down to \$1.50 for Commercial No. 1. Certified No. 1 seed has been priced at \$2.10. All prices are for treated seed in bags, at farm or shipping point. Prices this year are down from last year and should encourage the wider use of high quality seed on more farms. In Haldimand County, Winter Wheat is an important crop both as a cash crop and as a source of feed for livestock on the farm. There is room for a larger acreage than was harvested this past year. It would be well to make your arrangements for a supply of seed as soon as possible.

The question of why fat tests vary from time to time is a perennial one and is always good for an argument. Actually they do vary even though errors may remain the same. Purchasers will vary on the individual cow basis. A few of the reasons for this that have been advanced include such items as time between milking—the shorter the time the richer the milk. The season of the year may have some effect on the fat content. Not milking the cow out thoroughly will tend to give lower fat tests. Change in feed composition, illness, are a few other factors that might cause a variation.

Don't forget to have those calves vaccinated at the proper age. There are plenty of veterinarians available to do the job for you and if the regulations are followed, the Live Stock Branch of the Department of Agriculture will pay the cost. According to the latest list of veterinarians just issued there are fourteen that have been appointed to do this work in Haldimand. Some of them live in adjoining counties but do work in this county. Theonus is on the threshold of what is yet to come. (continued on page five)

GOVERNMENT SHOULD PUT "LIFE" ON PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND SCHOOLS!

As a former School Trustee, we know something about schools and their upkeep. We know that taxes are levied quite a bit by building up the field of school buildings, but by Government buildings. It is not only Government buildings that are long outlived, but also public buildings and Federal, that have long outlived their usefulness by being outgrown and outmoded.

Unfortunately these buildings can not be replaced right now because building costs are high and space is at a premium! But proper planning of a replacement fund could insure such a building being scrapped, sold, torn down and replaced, say after ten years.

The savings to the taxpayer would be immense. The problem of space would no longer be eliminated. A solution would not have to be used as a makeshift, but the maturity date arrived it would simply be replaced or displaced or replaced by money in the fund.

Think what a periodic impact this would give the building trades too!

WAITING FOR FROST

With summer still in full swing during the traveller, fisherman and camper, there's one group that in the latter part of summer tends to be less enthusiastic about the great outdoors. Their banner the paper sweats, they are the hay fever sufferers.

But of many a wisecrack, they wish summer away, longing for fall. If the disease is not eliminated, it will be more dramatic, or its effect evident to other people. The pollen season, non-sufferers might take the affliction more seriously. But the reddened nose and swollen eyes give everyone a damp and gloomy atmosphere.

Common ragweed is an annual, grey green in color with bushy branches and finely divided leaves. It varies from 3 inches to 3 feet in height and has yellowish-green flowers borne on long spikes at the ends of the stems. Co-Operative Effort Necessary to Eliminate Dreaded Ragweed Pest

farmer to notify the veterinarian. Make sure he holds an agreement with the Minister of Agriculture. Calves may be vaccinated any time after they are four months old and before reaching the tenth month. However, if any cattle are being shipped to the U.S. they must be treated between the sixth and ninth months.

Up to the middle of August there was over 20 million more pounds of poultry-meat processed through registered stations than during the same period of last year. Over 15 million pounds of this increase was in chickens under four pounds (broilers), as but right here in Ontario there is this province produced well over half of the broiler meat produced in the Dominion. To make matters worse, the month were approaching 900 per cent of what they were a year ago.
