### PROVINCES ARE NOW ASSURED OF HELP

The premiers of Canada's 10 provinces, although they got no federal commitment on immediate changes in tax-sharing arrangements, left last week's federal-provincial fiscal conference with assurances of federal aid in some directions.

Prime Minister Diefenbaker announced plans for a \$11,500,000-a-year expansion in the federal share of provincial costs of unemployment relief. This would be done by removing the so-called "threshold" at which the federal treasury steps in to help provinces care for their unemployed. This threshold now is set at 45 per cent of a province's population.

He also announced a start some time in the New Year on federal payments towards provincial hospital insurance plans, without waiting — as the predecessor Liberal Government intended — until a majority of the provinces with a majority of the country's population were committed.

### THE HISTORY OF THE CHRISTMAS TREE

Some historians trace the lighted Christmas tree back to Martin Luthi, who lived from 1483 to 1546. The story is that while strolling through the countryside on a Christmas Eve under a brilliant starlit sky, his thoughts turned to the nativity of the Christ Child. Luthi was impressed with the beauty of the heaves and the wintry landscape. He observed the snow-dusted evergreen trees sparkling in the moonlight. Returning home, he related the experience to his family and attempted to reproduce the outdoor scene. To a small evergreen tree he attached lighted candles to simulate the reflections of the starlit heaven—the heaven that looked down over Bethlehem on the first Christmas Eve.

This would date the first lighted Christmas tree prior to 1546. However, the use of candles apparently did not at once become firmly established as a decoration because mention of the Christmas tree custom in Strasbourg a century later does not refer to lights. At first, lights on a tree were considered ridiculous or "child's play." Until about 1700 the Christmas tree custom spread to the Rhine River district. From 1700 on when lights were accepted as part of the decorations, the Christmas tree was well on its way to becoming a tradition in Germany. During the American revolution the tradition of the Christmas tree crossed the Atlantic with the Hessian soldiers. A description of Christmas festivities at Fort Dearborn, Ill., in 1804, mentions a Christmas tree. However, the practice did not gain much headway on this side of the Atlantic until about the middle of the nineteenth century when, after a year of controversy and doubt, it became an established custom in Cleveland, Ohio.

Finland is credited with having accepted the custom about 1800. Denmark, Sweden, 1820 and Norway show that 35,000 Christmas trees were purchased per source of about 1830. From these Scandinavian countries the custom spread to the United States in 1800.

At first, the trimmings, if any, consisted mostly of tufts of cotton and strings of popcorn and cranberries. Other decorations were replicas of foodstuffs, flowers, paper ornaments and the like. Such trimmings have long since been replaced by factory-made, highly coloured ornaments, tinsel, strings of electric lights and various novelties.

The traditional use of evergreen trees during the Christmas season provides a time when all Canadians are brought into close contact with the fragrance and freshness of the forest. Christmas trees probably add more to mark the period of "peace on earth—good will toward men" than any other product of the soil. Indoors and outdoors, Christmas trees have become essential for decorative purposes in the homes, in the parks and on the streets, in churches and in business houses. Christmas would seem barren without them. The spreading branches serve most fittingly too, as a delightful hiding place for Santa Claus' presents for children and adults.

The Christmas tree is a symbol of a living Christmas spirit.

### Big Buffalo Herd In Far Northwest Steadily Growing

The 15,000 buffalo now roaming the lush and smiling of Wood Buffalo national park owe their existence to the Winnipeg fur trader, an Indian and the Federal Government.

The Indian was Walking Coyote, and his part in the story began in 1872 when the West's buffalo population was on the verge of extinction after indiscriminate slaughter. In that year, he drove four buffalo calves from southwestern Alberta to the St. Ignace Mission in Montana.

The fur trader was C. B. Alloway. Later they were turned into a park near Banff in the Rockies.

From those nine calves, which started increasing about 80 years ago, the come-back has reached the stage where the Federal Government is considering allowing hunters into the Alberta-North-West Territories boundary.
