

In discussing the question "Is Parity Income Enough?" Haldimand farmers through their Farm Forums said that obtaining parity income is not the most important problem in agriculture.

The Cranston Forum of Oneida Township felt that a more important problem was a system to obtain the basic cost of production of farm crops would be helpful so that a farmer could compare his cost of production with the average and it would give a basis on which farm prices could be set in order to give the farmer a fair profit. We cannot expect farm prices to be high enough for the inefficient farmer to realize a large profit.

Sims Locks Forum also stated that marketing is one of the chief farm problems and that farmers must support their farm organizations to make them more effective.

28 No. 4 Canboro reported that efficiency, management, production and marketing are important problems, as well as accidents, disease and crop failures.
