The Following Statements are from Mr. Charlton's Radio Talks :

ABOUT TAXATION

In the past 11 years, Liberal Government surpluses have amounted to \$2,104,000,000 by their own figures. In 1956-57 alone they admit a surplus of \$283,000,000. Actually it was something over \$500,000,000 that is, over \$120 for every average Canadian family of four. We CAN and we WILL put an end to this overtaxation.

During the last Conservative government at Ottawa the Federal share of all taxes levied in Canada was 45 per cent. By 1954, under Liberal governments, it swelled to 76 per cent. The Liberal government got richer and richer while provinces and municipalities got poorer and poorer, instead of "take-it-or-leave-it" tax "deals," we can and we will assure all the provinces and their Municipalities their fair share of tax revenues.

OLD AGE PENSIONS, SOCIAL SECURITY

It was a Conservative Government which in 1935 first introduced an Unemployment and Social Insurance Act. Not even one Conservative M.P. voted against Family Allowances and Old Age Security in 1951. Instead of the present niggardly Old Age Pension, we can and we will tie these Pensions to the cost-of-living. Other Social Security will be treated with similar realism.

AGRICULTURE

The past 10 years has seen the cost of what the farmer must buy increase 58.2 per cent, while the price of what he sold increased only 17 per cent. Between 1951 and 1956 prices for his products fell 21.8 per cent. As a result, not only does the farmer suffer, but the workingman who makes the things the farm-

er buys also goes short. We can and we will change this through flexible price supports based on a fair price-cost relationship, and announce these support prices well in advance of production periods.

LABOUR LEGISLATION

Instead of the present patchwork of hit-or-miss Labour Laws, we can and we will, in consultation with management and labour, make Canada's Labour Legislation uniform and up-to-date. The tangled mess of red tape and delay which obstructs Unemployment Insurance at present will be cut away. We can and we will eliminate waiting periods, pay claims promptly, extend the benefit period, increase benefits and allowable earnings.

TRADE AND MARKETS

To correct our seriously unbalanced foreign trade position (with the U.S. alone we have a deficit of \$1,659,000,000), we can and we will institute effective measures to regain our Commonwealth and world markets and develop new markets for agricultural, primary and manufactured products; protect Canadians against unfair competition from low-living-standard areas and "concealed" dumping.

PARLIAMENT

Most important of all, we can and we will put an end to the arrogant, dictatorial "Who's to stop us" kind of government that uses "closure" to gag Parliament, refuses information to the people's representatives, makes a mockery of parliament and fosters the rubber-stamp-yes-man who bows meekly to the dictates of party bosses. We will make Parliament once again truly answerable to the people.

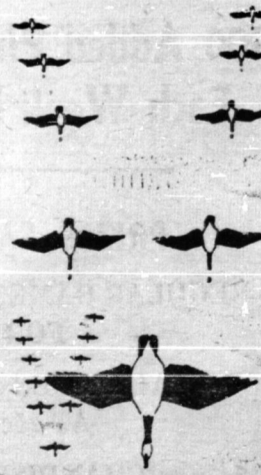

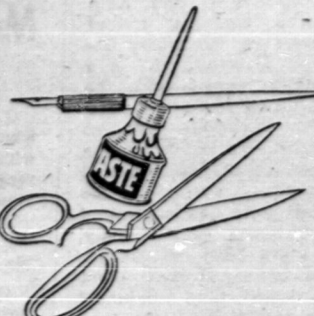

Whatever the outcome of the election next Monday, the only criticism we will have of the result will be directed to those who failed to exercise their franchise. We'll readily admit we get more than a little disturbed to hear anyone say "What difference does it make whether I vote or not?"

Quite rightly that one vote doesn't make much difference, but when the total is added up after every election it is found that those one votes total between one-quarter and one-third of all the eligible voters in Canada. The results of the opinions registered by those who do vote usually elect a Government supported by fewer than one-half of the eligible electors. Now that is not likely to be the case if all eligible electors, save the lame and the halt, took time to cast their ballot on election day.

The political parties seeking support in the election next Monday have been beating their brains out trying to get their message across to the electors. Any voter with even the slightest interest in the affairs of the Nation should have little difficulty in making up his or her mind as to how to vote in any event. The decision belongs to the individual and the privilege of registering that opinion by a secret ballot should not be considered lightly. A continuing disinterest on the part of the electorate is the surest road to dictatorship. There may be those who want that kind of government in Canada, but we hope they ever remain in minority. Please do your duty on election day. Vote as you like - BUT VOTE.

Complacency and apathy, those terrible twins, may decide this coming election. It is doubtful if more than 65 per cent of the electors bother to vote. Such democratic lethargy would help the Grits. Even so we doubt that they'll get 30 per cent of the qualified vote or 44 per cent of the actual vote. But they'll probably win by a minority vote as they did last time because the remaining 56 per cent of the vote will be split three ways with the Tories receiving 35 per cent and the other 21 per cent divided between the Socialists and Socials with the latter most likely to show the bigger gain.

We regret having predicted the last B.C. election so accurately, otherwise we'd not be sticking out our necks again with this election forecast. The prediction is not the result we hope for because the Grits on their record and their behaviour during this campaign deserve defeat. What we fear is that the result may be inconclusive, chaotic, replacing arrogance and authority with indecisiveness and timidity. The Socials are openly aiming for such a balance of power and as little as 15 per cent of the ballot may give it to them. Don't sell those Socials short. They surprised B.C. when they first came to power although that vote was more anti-coalition than pro Social. Credit and so close that only a judge's decision regarding one seat really decided the issue against the C.O.F. But having got their foot in the door, the Socials are more insistent and persistent than a brush salesman. Remember the fable of the Arab and the camel. It's a pity that the opposition parties couldn't get together sufficiently to defeat the common foe, but in these falsely lush times, unlikely opponents are talking to us as if we were a lot of short-nosed morons and we fear that's exactly what too many of us will be when June 10th arrives.
