The increase for the month of April itthere has been quitte a marked increase in the number of turkey poults hatched in the province. From January 1st to April 30th that has amounted to 45.4 per cent in Ontario or slightly more than 300,000 birds. On top of all this there is the very large broiler hatch with corresponding increases. The question might well be asked as to what is to become of this increase in product. Either the population will have to increase or the per capita consumption will have to be still further boosted.
