WHAT WAS HORACEVILLE?

The solid stone walls of "Horaceville" in March Township, Carleton County, Ontario is all that remains of a period of pomp and scientific society provided by a community of retired English army and naval officers. They settled there about 1819 and gave numerous formal dinner parties in their wilderness homesteads. The great Carleton County fire of 1870 destroyed all but "Horaceville." This unique settlement had dreamed of becoming the capital of Canada, with a naval station and a university—and just 20 miles away, it all came true.

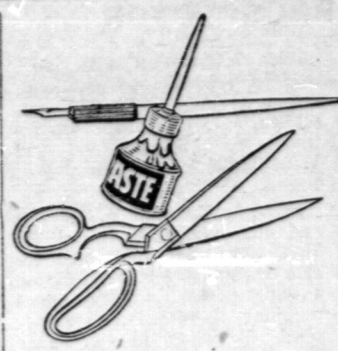

The political parties are doing their best to arouse some enthusiasm for the general election which takes place on June 10th. John Diefenbaker, leader of the Progressive-Conservatives, has been working the hardest of all leaders in this respect. The Prime Minister seems content to adopt a secure approach to the campaign. Selwyn Lloyd, leader of the Liberals, has been beating the drums, but with little apparent effect in Eastern Canada. M. J. Coldwell is restricted in his campaigning by reasons of health.

John Diefenbaker's criticisms of the Government have been well received throughout his tour and indications are that he will gain strength for the party he represents. The present Liberal Government has held office continuously since 1935 and in last Parliament held a commanding majority. No one with an appreciation of the system of government under which we are governed will deny that this is not a satisfactory condition. Although the Progressive Conservative party was the official opposition in the last parliament and has always been when the Liberals were in power since Confederation, the number of seats held were not proportionate to the overall vote cast and certainly not sufficient to carry on Government to the maximum degree of efficiency. The load is too heavy.

It seems to us that the results of the forthcoming election are extremely important to the future of Canada. In the best interests of the Nation, in the best interests of the Liberal Party as well, more Progressive Conservatives should be sent to Ottawa. The two party system is meant to afford the citizens of the country an alternative Government whenever dissatisfaction with the existing government arises. A smashing defeat for the Conservatives this time will negate the progress of this system for all time to come. While the Social Credit Party and the C.C.F. have shown sectional strength in the past, it is ridiculous to class them as National Parties so far as the forthcoming election is concerned. Therefore the only way to voice objection to the Government in power is to vote for the Progressive Conservative candidate.

Some of our good friends will say that the conclusions stated here are only what one might expect from a rank Tory. However, we feel in this instance we are voicing a profound truth which merits serious consideration. A more reasonable balance of power at Ottawa would have prevented the sorry spectacle which featured the last Parliament and no thinking Canadian is proud of the record over the past four years. We are not blaming the politicians—not the Government. The responsibility for our type of Government rests entirely upon the shoulders of the voters. On June 10th they will have the opportunity of expressing themselves. Let us hope the voting record is better than it has been in the past.

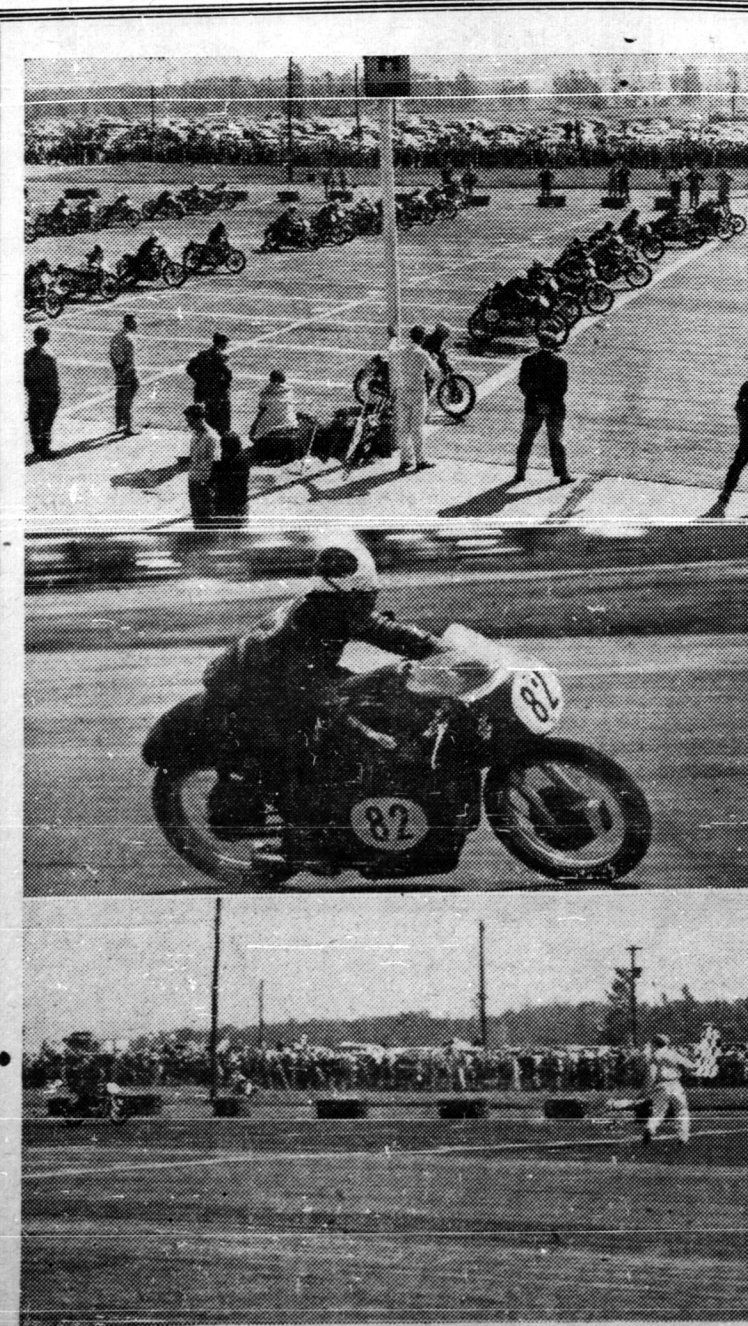
