Archaeological students of the University of British Columbia, uncovered two skeletons there. They are believed to be those of Indians who lived at least 2,000 years ago.

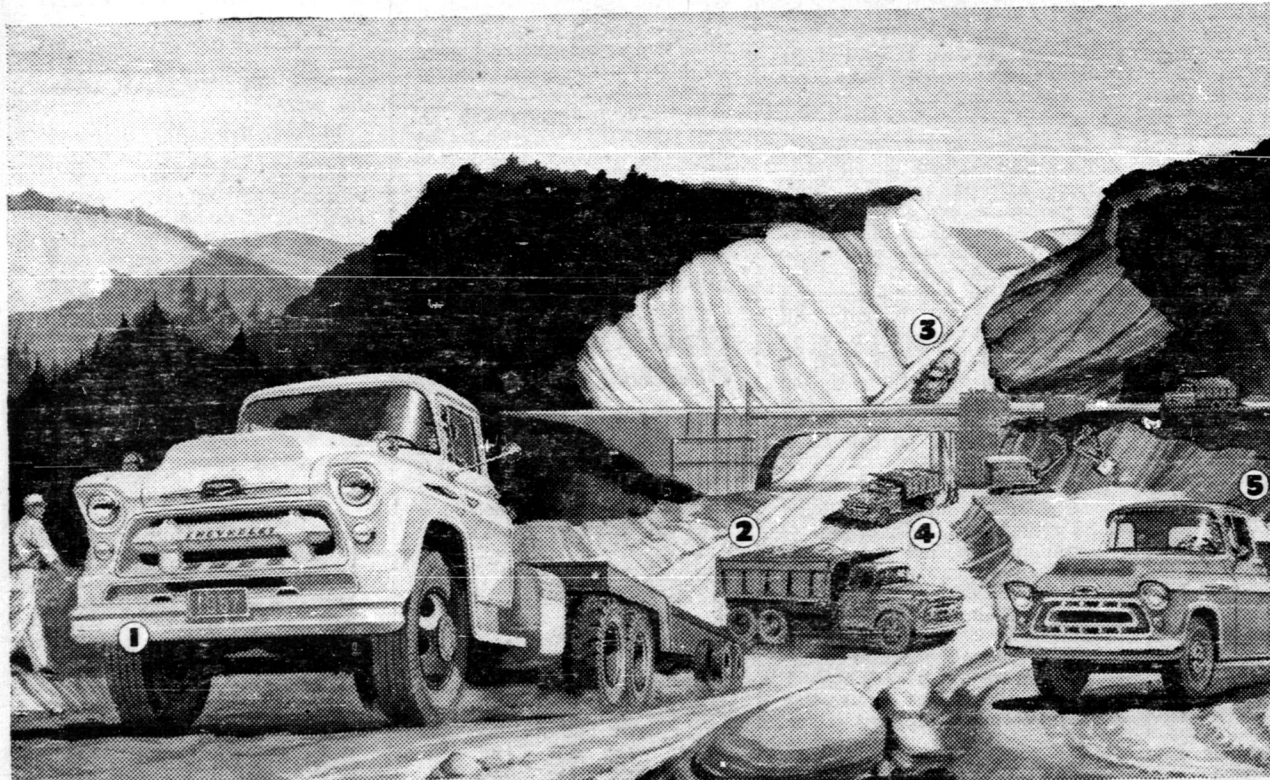
