While it may seem a little late for this year, there is a new circular that should be in the hands of every combine operator. As a matter of fact it would be a good idea to get a copy now and study it during the winter season and thus be ready for the next harvest season. The booklet is entitled "Efficient and Safe Operation of the Combine" and can be obtained from the office of your agricultural representative. It discussed the functions of the various parts of the combine and their proper adjustment, the various attachments, windrow harvesting and the care of the combine. Special attention is given to the safe operation of this piece of equipment. Get your copy the next time you are in town or drop a note to your agricultural representative.

The lowly and ordinary strip cup can be the most important tool in the production of high quality milk recently. Its careful and regular use enables the dairyman to discover early evidences of mastitis. Similarly any flakes, spots or watery milk can be noted and that cow can be milked last and carefully examined for mastitis as well as preventing anything happening later would lower the quality of milk that goes off the farm. The udder is the most important machine on a cow and regular and prompt attention should be given to any changes that take place. The strip cup is a good start in finding these changes.

Where Was Welland Canal Begun?

A memorial cairn at Allanburg, Ont., marks the spot where the first sod for the original Welland Canal was turned.
