HUNTING SEASONS
Listed below is some information for the hunters of the Lake Erie District which takes in Essex, Kent, Elgin, Lambton, Middlesex, Norfolk, Huron, Lincoln and Welland counties, as released by Conservation Officer C. R. McKeown:
PHEASANT—Hunters should find more pheasants this year, particularly in Essex, Kent and Niagara Peninsula. Open season this year is from October 28th to November 25th inclusive. Bag limit 3 cock pheasant back to normal and the bag limit for the two day shot, October 30th and 31st.
RUFFED GROUSE—Conditions are much the same as last year with increases shown in Norfolk, Haldimand, Middlesex and Lambton counties. Season November 11th to November 23rd inclusive. Bag limit per day 3, possession 20.
HUNGARIAN PARTRIDGE—The season, September 28th to October 14th inclusive. Bag limit 8 per day, 16 possession limit. Niagara Peninsula carries a population of Hungarian Partridge that appears to be increasing.
COTTON TAIL—Open season November 2nd to February 28th. Bag limit 6 per day. There should be plenty of Cottontail for the hunters this coming season in all part of the district. Ferrets are not permitted.
EUROPEAN HARE—Season November 2nd to February 25th. Reports and surveys show that hunters should not expect to find any increase, and in fact the population appears to be showing some decline.
SQUIRREL—Open season November 11th to November 30th inclusive. 5 per day, 10 possession limit. There appears to be plenty of squirrel throughout the whole area. The squirrel hunters should be well satisfied in the 1957 season. The squirrel season has been extended for the year to allow a greater harvest and a longer period for hunting of this species.
WOODCOCK—Season October 6th to December 14th inclusive. Bag limit 8 per day, possession 16. Much information available at present but there are some favourable places for woodcock and usual hunting may be expected.
DUCKS—Season October 6th to December 14th inclusive. Bag limit 8 per day, possession 16. One woodcock permitted in daily bag. General surveys on the North American continent show that ducks are somewhat increased in the last two or three years and depending on weather conditions hunters can expect equally as good shooting as 1956 if not better. Duck hunters are urged to hunting in the marshes of Long Point Provincial Park for a few days should note that this area is not included in the Long Point Provincial Park now, therefore no special licence is required.

MAN ASSISTS NATURE
