Even in 1951, the best year from the farmer's point of view, one hour of the average industrial worker's wages would only buy 6.0 quarts. Comparable figures for eggs are 1939—1.4 dozen; 1956, 2.4 dozen; butter 1939 1.7 lbs.; 1956, 7.6 loaves and flour 1939, 13.8 lbs.; 1956, 19.9 lbs.

Dairy farmers should certainly be on the alert when operating their milking machines tos ee that the teat cups are not left on too long. Many nows can be maked out in three to four minutes while a few take little longer. It is then necessary to know your cows and know the length of time required by each. Production of milk is a continuing process and there will always be some milk and there will always be some milk available no matter how long the machine is left on. However, there is grave danger of mechanical injury being done to the teat and the udder and it would appear that many cases of mastitis have been traced to the milking machine in this way. Not that the machine in itself caused the that the machine in itself caused the trouble but injury has been caused by it being left on too long and the mammary system has thus been predisposed to the disease.
