On the Farm Front There is no doubt as to the importance of eliminating brucellosis from the herds in Haldimand County. This disease has already caused heavy losses and needs to be treated as soon as possible. It is found however, that many cattle owners like to have their herds free of brucellosis and are continuing to suffer as it is a disease that seems to continue for a considerable time. For this reason if for no other the new control plan should be put into effect. It can only be accomplished by cattle owners signing up in sufficient numbers to have the County declared as such an area. If brucellosis is not given within 3 or 4 weeks. A comparison of the D.H.I.A. figures for Haldimand for the years 1951 and 1956 brings out some interesting facts. In other words, the net returns per herd increased from \$71.90 to \$78.00. It was also found that the number of pounds of concentrate fed per cow equivalent was reduced from 1685 pounds to 1206 pounds. In other words, the dairy herd operator was learning to do a much more efficient job of feeding. Likewise the number of man hours per cow was reduced from 183 hours to 76 hours. Here the operator has been able to cut his time by more than half by adopting labour saving methods and devices. This was done without increasing his investment. On the other hand he produced an extra hundredweight of milk. It should be noted that these are Haldimand figures. The machine operating season is with us again. Let us make it a safe one. Let us make it a speedy or a high centre of gravity or a quick clutch can roll tons of steel over us. Let us make it safe. Let us frequently right here in Haldimand keep the children away from playing with the tractor. Be careful when fueling the tractor. Avoid carrying extra passengers on the tractor.
