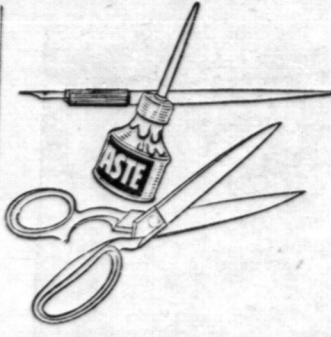

IMMUNIZATION FOR POLIOVIRUS LITTS FOR JARVIS AND WALPOLE TOWNSHIP

INITIAL SERIES MAY 12th — JUNE 9th

The first and second doses of Polio Vaccine will be given on May 12th and June 9th respectively to all pre school children six months of age and over who have NOT received the vaccine previously. This will be given at the Jarvis Public School at 1.30 P.M. and will be for all pre school children in Jarvis and Walpole Township and will be the only clinics held before summer for initial series.

PLEASE NOTE! — The third dose of Polio Vaccine will also be given on June 9th at 1.30 P.M. at Jarvis Public School to those children in Jarvis School Section ONLY who received two doses in October and November 1957.
