## ONTARIO HYDRO CUT COST OF ELECTRIC SPACE HEATING

Ontario Hydro has announced that space heating will now pay only for the monthly service charge of \$4 a month, the number of kilowatt-hours consumed, which was established in 1924 has been eliminated and a new rate schedule introduced. Residential consumers using electric energy for

by Ontario Hydro as the main advantage of electric space heating are safety, cleanliness, and the comparatively low cost of installation. Finer control of temperatures in individual areas of the home may also be achieved with an electrical system. In announcing the new rate schedule, Ontario Hydro stated that domestic-type customers will be billed in one of two ways, depending upon the amount of floor area heated. Those using electricity to heat less than 25 per cent of a dwelling's floor area will have such energy registered on existing meters and will be billed at current domestic rates. Those heating more than 25 per cent of a dwelling's floor area will have the energy metered separately, and will be billed at a special rate. For rural domestic customers of Ontario Hydro, this rate will be 1.5 cents net a kilowatt-hour; for domestic

## YOUR ALLERGY AND YOU

About 30 per cent of the population is potentially allergic to some "foreign" object or substance, according to Kay Kenyon, M.D., in an article in the August issue of *Chateau*.
