Five doctors had good news for parents last week: Salk vaccine in Ontario is preventing polio among school children. They reported on a three year study of the Salk program, believed the first such report yet made, in the Canadian Medical Association Journal. Their survey showed that for every case of the disease among vaccinated school children, there were seven cases in the non-vaccinated group. Only one Ontario child who re-

ceived the full three shots developed polio, and of 1,800,000 vaccinated in 1955, 1956 and 1957 only 25 who did not receive two shots developed it. No cases were blamed on the vaccine it-
self.

Already 95 per cent of the children under 15 have had three shots, and doctors said they urged active parents as well to get the vaccine, no matter what their age. Only a few thousand adults have been vaccinated so far.

Children At Races
Starting this week the kids can come see their parents take a flyer on the horses—so long as they don't bet themselves.
