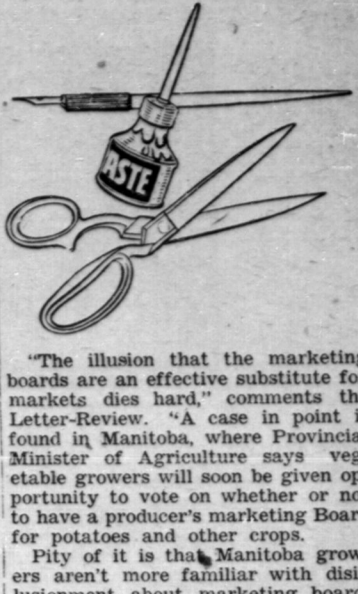

"The illusion that the marketing boards are an effective substitute for markets dies hard," comments the Letter-Reviewer. "A case in point is found in Manitoba, where Provincial Minister of Agriculture says vegetable growers will soon be given opportunity to vote on whether or not to have a producer's marketing board for potatoes and other crops.

Pity it is that Manitoba growers aren't more familiar with disillusionment about marketing boards so evident in other parts of the country.

One big trouble with marketing boards is that they are compulsory; if majority of vegetable growers favor setting up a board, then all farmers, whether they like it or not, must sell exclusively to the Board. And all must accept the prices set by the board, to be remunerated for their produce in terms of the fluctuating eye of the consumer, but on the arbitrary rules set down by board officials.

Marketing Boards are bad for the farmers and for consumers. They constitute a costly bureaucratic middleman with monopolistic powers, which deprive the consumer of the benefits of competition and deprive the farmer of his freedom to sell as he sees fit."
