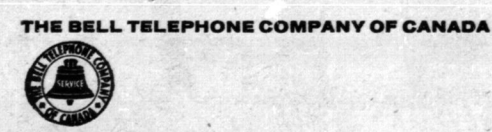

FENCE ROW GROWTH SHOULD BE CONTROLLED Weed trees and shrubs in fence rows are strictly for the birds. To the farmer, foul fence bottoms mean that his crops are being robbed of moisture and nutrients. Plants such as barberry and buckhorn act as alternate hosts to crop diseases and the presence of these hosts multiplies the incidence and amount of damage to susceptible crops. The Ontario Department of Agriculture Circular 750 gives further information on the control of weed plants and weeds in waste places, as well as most fence row weeds. A solution of 32 to 48 ounces of brushkill (24-42-42.5 mixture) in 100 gallons of water is recommended for such woody plants as apple, barberry, buckhorn, dogwood, evergreens and hard maple.

A basal bark spray made up of 32 oz. acid equivalent of brushkill in 10 gallons of fuel oil may be applied at any time of year. This spray is applied to the bottom 18 inches of the stems, making sure that the entire stem and any exposed roots are covered. This same spray applied to stumps, including cut surfaces, is very effective in preventing regrowth. Ontario Department of Agriculture Circular 750 gives further information on the control of weed plants and weeds in waste places, as well as most fence row weeds. A solution of 32 to 48 ounces of brushkill (24-42-42.5 mixture) in 100 gallons of water is recommended for such woody plants as apple, barberry, buckhorn, dogwood, evergreens and hard maple.
