LEAD POISON COMBON AS A CATTLE POISON

During the summer pasture season there are many types of poisons which may affect cattle, and of all these poisons are caused by plants. According to the Ontario Veterinary College, lead in its various forms is one of the most common cattle poisons.

Cattle that are suffering from chronic lead poisoning frequently show weakness and a stiffness of the joints. In the acute form, lead poisoning may result in a champing of the jaw, trembling, a tendency to walk in circles, and even blindness. Good hay pastures and barnyards can do much to prevent lead poisoning. Old paint cans, discarded car batteries, and lead arsenic sprays are some of the common sources of lead poisoning in cattle.

Farmers are warned that a cow suffering from rabies may show symptoms very similar to lead poisoning. A veterinarian should be consulted for diagnosis and treatment.
