To oil floors, wash windows, clean electric lights, make minor repairs, replace broken window panes, etc. at the direction of the Property Committee.

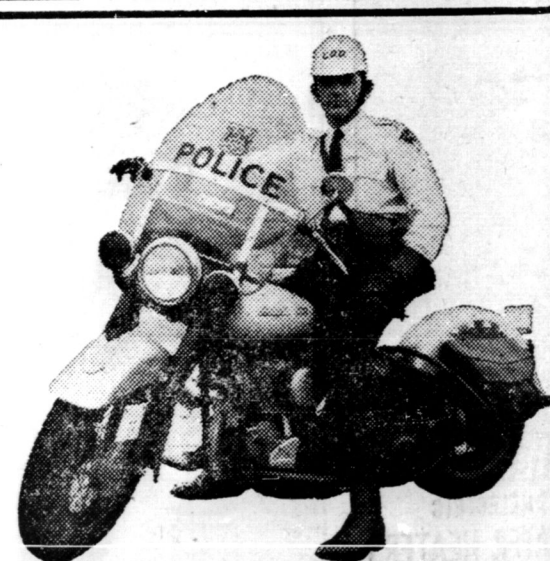
To put storm windows on in the fall and remove in the spring;
