

STATISTICS VITAL IN AGRICULTURE

On June 1st each year the Ontario Department of Agriculture in co-operation with the Dominion Bureau of Statistics conducts a survey of the number of live stock and poultry on farms and the acreage sown to various field crops.

The success of this survey depends on the co-operation of farmers in filling in and returning the questionnaires. A widespread response from all types of farmers is needed in order that the statistics can be based on a sufficiently large number of reports to constitute a representative sample of farms throughout Ontario.

The statistics obtained from the June 1st survey provide the basis for estimating changes in the production of crops, live stock, poultry and dairy products. Reliable statistics provide vital information for negotiations and for the construction of agricultural price support programs.

The Ontario Department of Agriculture provides an extensive picture of agricultural conditions by making certain to fill in the mailed questionnaire which he will receive on June 1st.

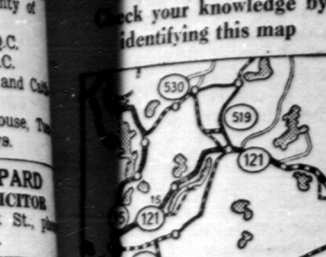
