What are the requirements of an Air Cadet?  
It was announced that British Canadian Citizen or other British subject who has been legally admitted to Canada for permanent residence may be enrolled in the Squadron Commanders' discretion. All cadets must be of good moral character and prepared to attend meetings regularly.

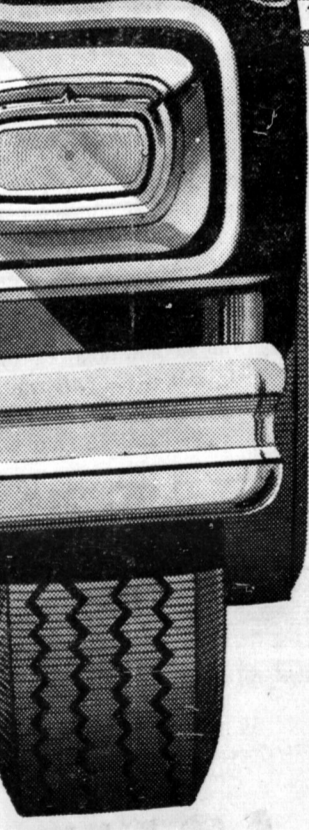
