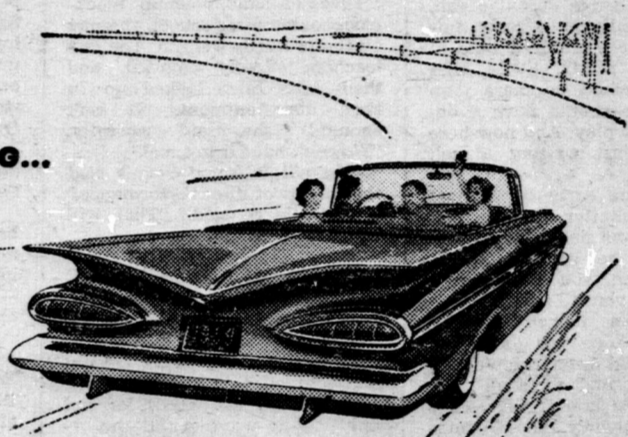
#### EVENING AUXILIARY

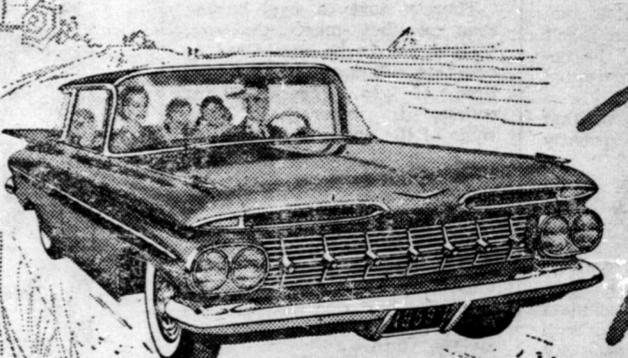

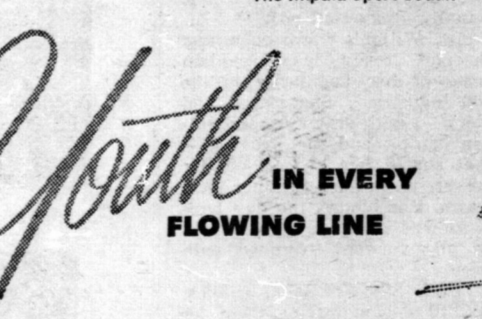
