Creamery butter production for October last in Haldimand County October last in Haldimand County was again down from the same month of last year and for the first time in several years the total production for the period up to the end of October was less than for the similar period in the former year. Production in Haldimand for October was 276,927 pounds and about 80,000 pounds less than a year ago. The total production for the ten months ending with October was 2,834,486 pounds and just 80,000 pounds below the figure for the same period in 19 58. On a provincial basis production was down by 10.4 per cent for the month and 2.6 per cent for the ten months.




